

YEAR 10 ENGLISH: SUMMER EXAMS INFORMATION

ENGLISH LITERATURE (Exam Board – Eduqas)

Component 2 – **2 hours 30 minutes** (60% of overall grade)

Date: **Monday May 21st**

Section A: *An Inspector Calls* (40 marks; approx 45 minutes)

You will be given an extract from the play and be asked to write about how a theme/issue/character/idea is presented both in the extract and at other points in the play.

Section B: *A Christmas Carol* (40 marks; approx 45 minutes)

You will be given an extract from the novel and be asked to write about how a theme/issue/character/idea is presented both in the extract and at other points in the novel.

Section C: Unseen poetry (40 marks; approx 60 mins)

Q1. (15 marks; 20 mins) You will be given a poem not previously studied in class and be asked to write about it, and its effect on you.

Q2. (25 marks; 40 mins) You will be given a second poem not previously studied in class, and be asked to compare it to the first poem in terms of what they are about; how they are organised; ideas the poet may want us to think about; choice of words, phrases and ideas; and your response to them.

Revision tips:

- Your exercise books are excellent revision guides: they are personalised and relevant to all parts of this exam. Go back over them and complete any unfinished exercises/tasks.
- Combine information in exercise books with material from the knowledge organisers to make flashcards for themes, characters, context and key vocabulary/quotes.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE (Exam Board – Eduqas)
Component 1 – 1 hour 45 minutes (40% of overall grade)
Date: **Monday June 25th**

Component 1: 20th Century Literature Reading and Creative Prose Writing

Section A (40 marks; 60 mins)

You will be given an extract from a piece of 20th century fiction not previously studied in class. You will be asked 5 questions testing your understanding of the text through information retrieval, language analysis, and critical evaluation of the text.

- Box out the command word for each question.
- Underline the focus word(s) for each question.
- Circle the mark tariff for each question. ***(Remember to spend the same amount of minutes on your answer as there are marks available.)***

Section B (40 marks; 45 mins)

You will be asked to write a piece of creative narrative (between 450 and 600 words long) from a choice of 4 different titles/stimuli.

Choose your title carefully.

Spend 5 minutes planning your story, and spend time at the end checking carefully to avoid unnecessary errors.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE (Exam Board – Eduqas)
Component 2 – 2 hours (60% of overall grade)
Date: **Monday July 2nd**

Component 2: 19th and 21st Century Non-Fiction Reading and Transactional/Persuasive Writing

Section A (40 marks; 60 mins)

You will be given 2 pieces of non-fiction to read: one written in the 21st century and one written in the 19th century. They will be linked by theme.

You will be asked 6 questions testing your understanding of the texts through information retrieval, language analysis, critical evaluation and comparison.

- Box out the command word for each question.
- Underline the focus word(s) for each question.
- Circle the mark tariff for each question. ***(Remember to spend the same amount of minutes on your answer as there are marks available.)***

Section B (40 marks; 60 mins)

You will be asked to write 2 pieces of transactional/persuasive writing (between 300 and 400 words long). You may be asked to write a speech; an article for an online or print newspaper; a letter.

Don't forget PAF (purpose, audience, form)

Consider the audience/readership for this piece of writing.

Plan at least 4 detailed and explanatory points.

Spend approx. 5 minutes planning your piece, 25 minutes writing, and try to allow checking time at the end to avoid unnecessary errors.

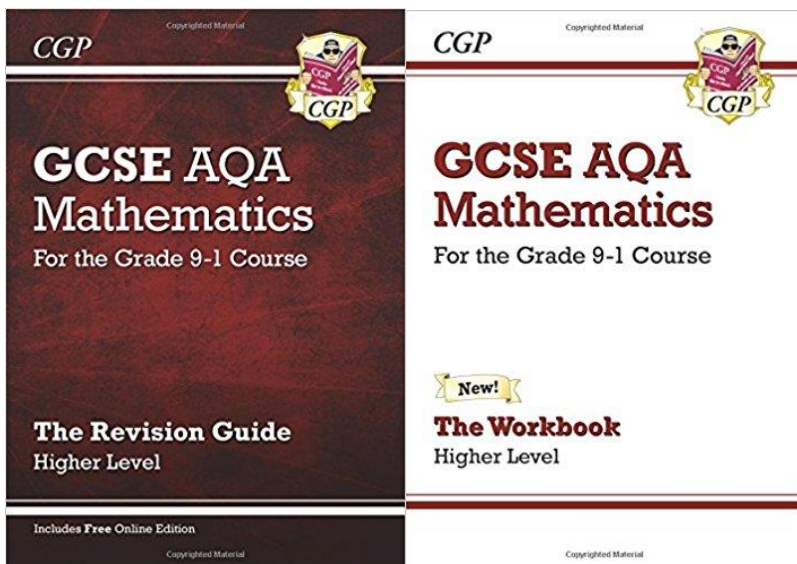

Black pens, pencils, ruler, protractor, compass and calculator (for paper 2 & 3).

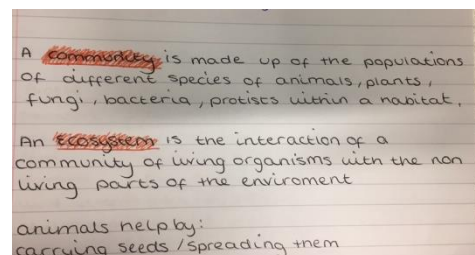
Year 10 Science Mock Support

- Highlight content you are unsure about. This can be a focus for revision

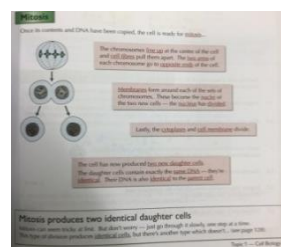
Class books

Revision guides

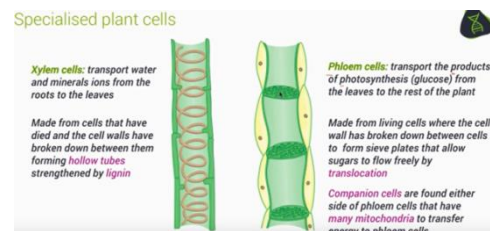
- Use them after you have highlighted what you are unsure about.
